March Launches Cancelled Club looks forward to April Activities

March around the county has been strange weather wise, and no less so in Kansas. Unusually cool weather has everyone longing for warmer weather and a chance to start outside activities. Our first scheduled launch saw a wind chills of 32 degrees, a ceiling of 1600' and winds from the north at 19 at the scheduled start time. The back up date 2 weeks later resulted in a steady rain in the morning with occasional snow flakes thrown in. The launch in Ellinwood became a meeting in Hutchinson. A nice group of 8 members discussed the upcoming launch in Hutch, celebrating the 40th anniversary of Apollo 13, and the upcoming launch at our new field in Buhler.

We have been corresponding with Dave Kovar of the FLARE NAR section in New Mexico in regard to the 40th Anniversary of the Apollo 13 launch at the Kansas Cosmosphere and Space Center. He will be bringing the scale launch pad and Saturn V model to launch at the Apollo 13 activities. He will also be launching a Mercury RedStone and Gemini Titan. KOSMO members will be assisting with the launch. The first activity is the SpaceWorks tour on April 15. This is free and members wishing to take the tour should meet in front of the Cosmosphere a little before 10am that day. Friday afternoon Apollo 13 will be showing at the Cosmosphere at 4pm followed by The Wonder of It All at 7pm. (some tickets may still be available for this movie, contact John Palmer) Saturday April 17 KOSMO members will meet in front of the Cosmosphere at 8am to assist with the model rocket launch. Those who have FRS radios are asked to bring them and use channel 7 (no quite code). At 8:30 at the football field next to the museum the launching will begin capped by the Saturn launch at app. 9am. At 10am the activities will move to the Sport Arena near the museum and will consist of a round table discussion with the flight directors of Apollo 13. An autograph session will follow. This should conclude at about noon. The Kosmonauts have received some free tickets to this event. Some may still be available, but if not, admission will be available for the nominal fee of \$5. A showing of the Apollo 13 movie will then be available again at 1pm. A dinner and VIP event end the day at 6 and 8:30. It does not appear that the club has tickets to these sold out events, but if one is available, it was moved that John Palmer attend as he has put in many hours coordinating with the Cosmosphere in regard to the model rocket launch.

It was moved that we give Dave Kovar one of our club hats and buttons. All members attending are urged to wear their club hats and a club T-shirt if you have one. Saturday morning Ron Shipley will distribute the new 30th anniversary club buttons designed by Steve Saner to club members

In other business, Keith Ravenstein reported that he had purchased two First Aid kits for the club. Mark Johnson will check on purchasing two fire bottles once NAR funds are available.

The last item of business was the upcoming launch in Buhler, Ks. Kirk Zongker reported it will be at the sports complex at the NE edge of town. The field should allow for models up to 1000' of altitude, mostly D power and below, although heavier models with E power should be ok.

The launch will run from 10am-5pm. \$3 for members, \$4 for non-members. (those making 4H qualifying flights will be allowed to fly for free). A BBQ will happened at noon for a minimal charge. A map of the launch site can be seen at our club's website www.kosmo427.org.

We ended the meeting looking at members recent rocket projects, checking out Dave Kovar's rockets on the internet, and discussing the current state of manned space flight. On to Hutch!!




