### **Minutes of KOSMO Annual Meeting 2010**

The annual meeting of the Kansas Organization of Space Modeling (KOSMO) took place Sunday Jan. 17, 2010 at the residence of John Palmer, Hutchinson, Ks. Lunch began at noon and was enjoyed by the 10 members present. Thanks go to John for the hamburgers, hot dogs, side dishes, and cookies. After a time of visiting, the members gathered in the basement for the meeting.

Keith Ravenstein, president, called the meeting to order at 1:10. Members in attendance included Keith Ravenstein, Duane Lanterman, Mark and Bonnie Johnson, John Palmer, Steve Saner, Fred Smith, Ron Shipley, Kirk and Grace Zonker. Minutes from the 2009 meeting were read and approved. The treasurers report was given by Duane Lanterman, provided by Rick Calvert, treasurer. There is \$50 in petty cash and \$361.84 in checking.

Election of officers was next on the agenda. Those elected for the new year included Keith Ravenstein President, John Palmer vice-president, Duane Lanterman secretary, Bonnie Johnson treasurer, Mark Johnson liaison, Steve Saner web master and Ron Shipley historian. After an extensive discussion on safety, 4 members were elected to a club safety committee, those being Rick Calvert, Keith Ravenstein, Mark Johnson, and John Palmer. (see safety committee paragraph below) Rick Calvert was thanked for his many years of service as club treasurer. Bonnie Johnson will contact Rose Hill bank in regards to the change in treasurer. A vote approved the addition of the current club president to the checking account.

Several members then paid their dues. A motion was made to waive the dues for the 2 families that were "founding members" in this year of celebration 30 years of KRAMO. This motion carried and the Mark Johnson family and Joe and Peggy Warnock were so honored.

The new safety committee will be responsible for making sure charged water bottles and a first aid kit is readily available at the launch sites. We currently have two water bottles. The purchase of 3 water bottles and two first aid kits was approved by vote. Mark Johnson will see if NAR funds are available for the water bottles. Keith Ravenstein will purchase two first aid kits from the Red Cross. One water bottles will remain with Mark Johnson in Wichita, two bottles and a first aid kit will stay in Hutchinson, and two bottles and a first aid kit will remain in Great Bend.


Keith Ravenstein announced a surprise award. He had been counting club sport flights during the year and John Palmer received a nice kit for the 21 flights he amassed during the year.




