Long story short, mainly through efforts by KOSMO member John Palmer arrangements were made and a joint FLARE/KOSMO event took place with tours of SpaceWorks, movie viewings, meeting the mission control personnel, the Apollo 13 astronauts, and of course helping with the launch of the Apollo rocket on an early April morning. Truly an event to remember.

June was our first real club launch and it was our annual contest KRAMO 30. We had a great two days of competition and sport flying and for the first time had a tie for overall champs between the KC Flying Monkey Team (Blake Goddard and Dave Bucher) and Keith Ravenstein.

In August six KOMSO members attended NARAM in Colorado and all that attended had a great time and spent more money than they intended.

September brought our only other successful club launch, although it too was delayed by two weeks by wind. We had a great time at FFFF at the Ellinwood Airport and Steve Saner was able to complete his Level 1 flight. Great job, Steve.

We got together in Oct. and Nov. had some bull sessions and ate official KOSMO food (pizza and hot dogs) but both events feel victim to the Kansas winds.

New members this year include Dave Miller of Larned and Ron Snow of Hutchinson. Welcome aboard ! First aid equipment and fire fighting equipment was acquired by the club through a grant from the NAR and efforts by Keith Ravenstein, Mark and Bonnie Johnson , and Ron Shipley.

Club members displayed their rockets and promoted the club at EAA fly-ins in Hays and Newton, Ks. This was new for the club and good exposure for us and the hobby.

Illness brought concern for two of our members this year. Both Bonnie Johnson and Joe Warnock spent time in the hospital. Through the skill of their doctors and prayers from friends and relatives both are doing well at years end.
