I can't believe it's been 10 years since we collaborated on the Launch Reenactment for the Apollo 13 40th Anniversary event at the Cosmosphere. I am sending this email to see if you would be interested in working together once again on a Launch Reenactment event for the Cosmosphere's Apollo 13 Honoring the Mission 50th Anniversary event coming up on the weekend of April 4th. I have already been in contact with the museum's Public Relation Coordinator, Carla Stanfield and they're definitely interested in our participation.

Let me know if this something that KOSMO would like to take on. I am still the President of the St. Louis Rocketry Association and will be talking about SLRA's participation at our next meeting coming up in a couple of weeks.

What Carla and I talked about is to make the Apollo 13 Launch Reenactment a STEM event for Hutchinson, KS middle school students that will be held during the school week at the KOSMO State Fairground launch area on the morning of Tuesday March 31st with possible back-up dates of April 1st and 2nd. Having the event at the Fairgrounds would enable us to have a full-up launch reenactment stepping the complete history of the US/Russian Space Programs from Germany (V-2)/Russia Vostok/United States White Sands Missile Range and culminating with the Apollo 13 Launch Reenactment. After the launch reenactment, attending classes will participate in a Precision Duration Lunar Spot Landing Competition. Awards would be presented to the top three teams.

I hope this event peaks your interest. I am really interested in working with you all once again in making this proposal a reality.
