HUTCH FAIR GROUNDS PLAYS HOST FOR TWO KOSMO LAUNCHES

Over the course of two weeks the KOSMO guys and gals spent 3 days launching rockets at the Ks. State Fair grounds parking lot. The first gathering was on May 21st and was a sport launch to make up for the cancelled April launch. It was not a perfect day wind wise but within our limits. Eight modelers put up 29 flights. An unusual amount of models suffered significant damage (5 total) and there was one motor malfunction. John Palmer's V2 was a little too realistic as it power pranged on an E9 resulted in a mangled model. Luckily, his recently finished Soyuz model performed well. The model is guite nice and it's the first time I remember this scale model at a KRAMO launch. The Goodwin family from Buhler, Ks. joined our club at Hutch and Sydney launched her SR71 prior to applying the black paint and entering it in the upcoming 4H fair. Like many SR71 Estes models this one flew horizontal about 50 feet up but made a safe landing. Brother Grant is also a 4H'er and plans on launching his model on a G or H at the Ellinwood Airport under the watchful eye of Keith Ravenstien June 18. Welcome aboard Goodwin's !!

Two weeks later we again gathered this time for the 31st edition of our competitive meet KRAMO . Mark Johnson has written up an article in this issue so I won't go into any details. You'll also find complete box scores for all the events. We had 47 contest flights and 17 fun flights. This was the first time in my 29 year KRAMO experience that all competitors flew in all events. This makes for a fun contest and I think shows that we picked good events and that people were willing to build even if it was outside their comfort zone. For me that means helicopter duration. This was the first one of my models (outside of the old Estes boilerplate model) that I didn't shred on its way up. That meant I actually got in a second flight. Not only that I still have a model to fly [†] another time. Wow, I don't know how to act. It was good to see Eric Martin and his kids sport flying with us again this year. They are so cute and love to fly their rockets. All in all, a great two weeks for our club.

KRAMO-31 – A Hot Time in Hutchinson

If nothing else, KRAMO-31 will certainly go on record as one of our hottest competition events ever...with temperatures at or above 100 degrees on both Saturday and Sunday. The hot weather no doubt kept some of our long-time competitors at home, but those of us who did come out enjoyed two days of flying and rocket talk. We had too few contestants and so we were forced to hold the event as an Open meet instead of a Regional – but for once, all the competitors flew in every event.

The two 'Precision' events, Open Spot Landing and Set Duration (40 seconds) were entirely flown on Saturday, so everyone ended up with the same conditions. With a breeze varying from 8 to 15 miles per hour, there weren't any real pole-hanging flights in Spot Landing. Steve Saner led the way with a 9.75 meter distance, followed closely by Ron Shipley's 10.57 meter effort. In Set Duration, Steve again came closest, with a 47-second effort (17.5%) for first place, followed by the Boris & Natasha Team's 30 seconds (25%) for second. All six entries posted qualified flights, with approaches ranging from streamer-duration models to Ron Shipley's D12-powered, 18-inch parachute model that caught a thermal that wouldn't let it go for 93 seconds. The flight still landed on the field, but within 30 feet of the street on the north side.

In 1/2A Helicopter, there were a variety of approaches. Keith Ravenstein made two good flights to take the win with a 51-second total using an Flis kit model, followed by John Palmer's 30 second total. Steve Saner and the Boris & Natasha Team both used the old 'Helix-A' design, although Steve's new model was much more successful than the Johnsons' 1988 bird, which chalked up a pair of DQ's and some damage. [Maybe, after 23 years, it's time for a new helicopter?]

A Boost-Glide proved to be the most hotly contested event of the weekend (high-temperature jokes not intended). All 12 flights by 6 competitors were qualified, although a couple of them were admittedly pretty ugly – but the wings caught enough air that they were definitely gliding, not just falling out of the sky. In the end, Keith Ravenstein's 71 second total took first, with the Boris & Natasha Team at 53 seconds and Ron Shipley following at 51 seconds not far behind.

B Eggloft Duration placed a severe stress on the population of eggs in local grocery stores. Out of 11 flights, 6 ended with some kind of mishap for the ovoid 'astronaut proxy' in the capsule. In the end, we had a first-place tie between Duane Lanterman and Steve Saner, both at 18 seconds, as nobody was willing to try really huge parachutes that might drift far off the field if they happened to open. That parking lot may have grass on it, but it's still a pretty difficult landing site for eggs!

Overall: Club President Keith Ravenstein took home the overall award, followed in order by Steve Saner, Duane Lanterman, John Palmer, Ron Shipley and the Boris & Natasha Team. During the weekend, we also enjoyed a group dinner at the Carriage Crossing down in Yoder as well as a late lunch on Sunday at Ken's Pizza, located about a mile from the launch field.
