# FFFF EXPERIENCES NEAR PERFECT WEATHER

Ten flyers enjoyed near perfect weather, with winds under 10 mph (from all 4 directions) and temps in the low 90's for this years edition of the club's Final Frontier Fun Fly. Due to soy beans lining the Ellinwood Airport, the launch was held on the open spaces of the Lanterman Family Farm two miles NE of the airport.

Of the 60 flights, there were an uncharteristic 9 glider flights. Clusters have been popular with our club and 6 flights had 2-7 motors on board. Most everyone put up a fair number of flights, Duane Lanterman topping the list with 8, followed with 7 flights each by Mark Johnson, Keith Ravensterin, and Ron Shipley. Steve Saner, Peter Bayless, and Linton Bayless recorded six flights. Wilder Parks and Fred Smith each had 5 flights with Ron Snow tallying 3.

Mark Johnson received the *flight of the day* trophy with his R/C D powered glider. It turned in some impressive flights, flying three times. Also in the running for the *flight of the day* were Linton and Peter Bayless for their 36D Squared drag race, Peter's ASP flight on an I285, and Ron Shipley's unique Uranus on a F32.

Wilder Parks from Hutch was flying with us for the first time. There was a nice flight of his Dr. Zook Soyuz and a new offering from Estes, the QCC Explorer that flew great twice on an E9. (This one caught a power line, only to be retrieved the next day by the local power company, thank you MidWest Energy)

Fred Smith flew his Falcon 4 times with D power. This nice looking model with breakaway lugs flies nice and high.

Duane Lanterman was involved in the rocket drag races placing 2<sup>nd</sup> in Jr. Dragster and launched his *America* at the conclusion of the playing of God Bless America shortly after noon. This was a tribute to all those who lost their lives on this date 10 years ago. A rocket glider and cluster model were also part of his launches.

Keith Ravenstein took first place in the 20 nwt second drag races, had two glider flights, and an *attempt* at a B-to-B chad staging of his helicopter model.

Steve Saner participated in the drag races taking first in Jr. Dragster and had successful flights of his Hydra 7 on 7 C6's, launched his spool rocket on an H123 and put up the days final flight with trusty Level 1 cert rocket on a H242.

Linton and Peter Bayless made the long drive from Shawnee Mission and launched a total of twelve flights. Three of Peter's flights were clusters and his I powered flight landed within 20 feet of the pad. Very nice flying! Linton had an armada of Estes kits including the Magician, Tomahawk, Eliminator, and an ancient Army Hawk. Thanks so much for making the drive and being part of our launch! Ron Snow flew his SR71 Stretched Alpha, his Mongoose Squared, and the Intrepid on a G38. Three successful flights. Good show Ron.

Ron Shipley took 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the 20 nwt seconds drags, flew his unique Star Duster model on a G50, and launched the previously mentioned Uranus.
