KOSMO/KCAR MEET TO PLAN NARCON 2012

Not a good day for launching rockets, but a great day to begin planning next years NARCON convention. 6 members from KOSMO and 2 members from KCAR (including Blake Goddard, Chairperson of the convention) meet in a corner booth at the burger/ice cream palace. Nearly 2 ½ hours passed as we discussed the schedule, possible speakers, food, registration prices, T-shirts, tours, etc, etc. The meeting generated a lot of discussion, give and take, and in general concusses on our goals and what we hope to present to our fellow rocketeers.

Ron Snow had a nice flight on his XS-R71 Stretched Alpha (hope I got that right) on a D. The Martin kids had a great time with 7 flights between them. Keith flew a number of his older models that have been in his fleet for a while. Linton Bayless had fun launching a variety of his nicely done Estes kits. Ron Shipley had a busy day, including a number of flights of his RonScud. (not in your Rockets of the World book by the way). Wildler Parks arrived later in the day but launched his very recently finished Magician in both day light and after sunset. Kudos for the KOSMOaut


