NIGHTFLIGHT FALLS VICTIM TO KANSAS WINDS

Anyway, when we got to the field in Hutchinson we found some folks flying kites and one guy zipping along in a "car" pulled by a parachute. (These are not good signs when you are planning on flying rockers.)

We had planned to meet wind or not and so those of us gathered were treated to some new equipment President Keith Ravenstein is working on. One (pictured on left) was a wireless launch system for away pads. It uses a modified remote car starter for arming and launching a rocket. It includes a PVC antenna tower and everything ends up storing in the launch box. Keith managed to get quite far down the field in his initial demonstration of this new piece of equipment. He also

showed us his new launch rack he is working on (pictured on right). It is quite versatile and well built. A larger version is also in the planning stages. Keith also explained in some detail a completely wireless system that he and Steve Saner have been discussing. It would be quite expandable utilizing a computer at each rack and using WiFi for communications. It also has a fairly hefty dollar and cents price tag. While this project is probably not planned for the near future he also ran by a version based in part on this design that is wired. In all probability this will be a topic that will be expanded upon at our annual meeting.

The National Association of Rocketry's 58th Annual Meet (NARAM 58) will be held next July23-29 near Walnut Grove, MO. John Buckley of the St. Louis Rocketry Association (SLRA) is going to be the Contest Manager for this event and is in charge of organizing the event. The event is sponsored by a consortium of organizations, St. Louis Rocketry Association, Kansas City Association of Rocketry, Kansas Organization for SpaceModeling, Launch Crue, and the Teeniemunde Rocket Club.

The primary need for KOSMO participation will be helping to run the sport launch range during the week of NARAM. Other things may come up as time goes on. KOSMO'S 35TH YEAR IN REVIEW

KOSMO'S 35th year began as is tradition with the annual meeting. Each year this is held in January to set the stage for the coming year. Held at the Lanterman residence this year highlights included Traci Ross being our NAR sponsored Jr. member and a design set for new KOSMO shirts.

Our first launch of 2015 took place in March at our Hutchinson, Ks field under ideal conditions and 45 flights took place.

In March KOSMO members assisted the Rush Co. 4H'ers with their Space Tech day. The morning session saw 23 young rocketeers building rockets, many for the first time. During lunch break it was announced that 4H'er and KOSMO member Traci Ross was going to the 4H Emerald Banquet later in the year, receiving a state 4H scholarship and was a state 4H record book winner in Space Tech. The afternoon included a group of youngsters building Skill Level two rockets.

SpringFest was twice delayed due to windy conditions and an abbreviated edition was finally held in May due to conditions less than ideal. None the less, Terry Blake, a student at K-State Salina put up a perfect Level One Cert Flight and Steve Saner wowed us with his Sky Hog on a K550.

June is always KRAMO time in Kansas (our annual contest). but this year a forbidding forecast caused its cancellation. Some modelers did arrive that Saturday morning and some sport flights took place under decent conditions.

July saw our club returning to LaCrosse and their airport for a 4H launch prior to their upcoming county fair. 18 fliers enjoyed the morning and things wrapped up prior to 1 o'clock as temps approached 97 degrees.

In Aug. a number of KOSMOnauts drove to the KC area for a regional NAR contest called Son of KRAMO. The KCAR section had invited us up to their field and the events were the same as the canceled KRAMO events. A very nice groups of 16 individuals or teams flew the two days and enjoyed their time together.

Our 25th annual Final Frontier Fun Fly had to be postponed two weeks, again due to winds but a nice group gathered at the Lanterman Family Farm and launched 37 rockets in Sept. Highlights included Luke Dyson's very successful Level One Cert flight, Duane Lanterman's first dual deploy flight, numerous flights from long time FFFF fliers Peter and Linton Bayless of Shawnee Mission, and Steve Saner's 6800' flight on a J motor.

October's Rocket'tober Fest and November's Night Flight once again fell victim to the Kansas winds. We did gather at the Night Flight field and that story is our cover story.

New members in 2015 included Jim and Rita Forythe and grandson of Russell and Luke Dyson and family from Sterling.
