"NIGHTFLIGHT" CONCLUDES SUCCESSFUL LAUNCH SEASON

Nov. 12 – The last scheduled launch of the KOSMO calendar year was at our Hutchinson field. Although cool, it was an excellent day for launching and ended with our annual night launching of rockets.

Absent for many a moon from our launches, we were joined by long time KOSMOnaut Rick Calvert and his family. His son RJ is carrying on the rocket tradition in the family and he launched his Estes Riptide three times. Hope to see much more of the Calvert's next year.

During the daylight hours we had 30 flights, with John Palmer accounting for 10 of them. All but one were his usual fleet of sport scale rockets. Steve Saner had 8 flights including 2 with his Noodle Rocket which put in its best flight with a D12. The majority of the model is one of those inexpensive "pool noodles". Duane Lanterman had 6 flights including one with an old Fliskits rocketman model that looks unfortunately a lot like Duane! Evan Beckman joined us and had three flights which included his Estes Interceptor, a very nice model to watch fly. Keith Ravenstein didn't fly any rockets this time around but kept busy at the launch control.

As the sunset and the temperatures dropped the pads were readied for the night launches. There were 8 flights in total and all went well except for the final one. Steve Saner mentioned that there might be a possible "cato" with the E9 on board and that's exactly what happened as it burst into a ball of flame and inflicted damage on the rear of the rocket. Steve has an excellent way of lighting his rockets and next issue of "the KOSMOnaut" will feature a how to article on his technique. As the smoke cleared, a very successful launch season came to an end. Inside this issue you will find a wrap up of the year in pictures. Looking forward to 2017 and what it holds for our club!



The kit will include the following3"X34" four slotted body tube
3" nose cone
29mm motor mount
28" chute
Nomex Blanket
12' of 1/2" Kevlar shock cord
Two 3" to 1.14" centering rings
Four 1/8" fins cut to shape
Various hardware (U bolt, t-nuts, washers, lock nuts)
Rail buttons


